- Innovative capacity building programme for FLR implementation in Malawi, a joint initiative of the Centre for Applied Systems Analysis (CASA) and IUFRO's Special Programme for Development of Capacities (IUFRO-SPDC)
- Trained and mentored 50 frontline staff from government, civil society and NGOs specifically to work as FLR facilitators
