Some information about IUFRO2019:

- approximately 2,200 participants, 70% from abroad
- 10 keynote speakers (topics can be found at http://iufro2019.com/news/)
- 20 subplenary sessions
- 190 technical sessions, with presentations of approximately 1,700 scientific papers
- a poster session featuring roughly 1,000 scientific projects
- 17 technical excursions (on Thursday, October 3)
- 2,000 m² of exhibition space featuring Brazilian and international exhibitors
- 82 events including IUFRO administrative meetings and side events

- Side events organized by institutions which are well-known in the global forest arena and meetings of IUFRO research groups during lunch or at the end of the day

 - entire day: the exhibition hall will be open to schools and the local community
