UNFF Welcomes Stronger Role of Science

The sixth session of the United Nations Forum on Forests (UNFF-6) was held from 13 to 24 February 2006 in New York. The Forum unanimously adopted a Resolution which contains several references to science and research. In particular, the policy makers welcomed a joint initiative by IUFRO, CIFOR and ICRAF on scientific assessments and reports.

Towards a Strengthened International Arrangement on Forests

After the UNFF had not been able to reach an agreement at its fifth session, the policy and decision makers were given the difficult task to address unfinished business and decide on the future of the international arrangement on forests (consisting of the UNFF and the Collaborative Partnership on Forests - CPF). After two weeks of negotiations, the Forum unanimously agreed on a Resolution which contains several elements that aim to strengthen the international arrangement on forests:



In the Resolution, the policy makers set four so called "Global Objectives on Forests": reversing the loss of forest cover and increasing efforts to prevent forest degradation; enhancing forest benefits and their contribution to international development goals, increasing the are of protected forests and areas of sustainably managed forests; and reversing the decline in official development assistance for sustainable forest management (SFM). The countries committed themselves to making progress towards the achievement of these shared Global Objectives on Forests by 2015. The four global objectives also constitute an important, universally agreed reference framework for activities in research and development cooperation.

Global Instrument on Forests

The negotiations in New York also revealed that a consensus on a legally-binding instrument on forests was out of reach. Hence, the discussions evolved around the idea of a voluntary instrument on forests. After intense negotiations, the Forum agreed on a process to conclude and adopt a non-legally binding instrument on forests at the seventh UNFF session in the year 2007. Such an instrument would aim to strengthen political commitment and action to implement SFM and to achieve the Global Objectives on Forests. The question of a legally-binding instrument will again be considered in the context of a review of the International Arrangement on Forests 2015.

Request for Continued CPF Activities and Scientific Assessments

The Forum also recognized the positive role of the CPF in supporting its work. It invited CPF members to continue and further develop the Global Forest Information Service (GFIS), led by IUFRO, and its other existing joint initiatives. Furthermore, the Forum welcomed the establishment of a joint initiative on science and technology that aims to support the UNFF by assessing available scientific information and producing reports on issues of high concern. The Resolution also includes commitments to provide greater support to scientific and technological innovations for SFM, and to strengthen forest education, research and development.

Through its Resolution, the Forum recognized the added value of an increased role of science in supporting decision-making. In the weeks and months to come, it will therefore be important for IUFRO to use this positive momentum and develop the proposed joint initiative on science and technology in more concrete terms together with our partners CIFOR and ICRAF.

The sixth session of UNFF was attended by about 600 participants representing governments, as well intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations. IUFRO was represented by the Executive Director. UNFF-7 is scheduled to be held from 16-27 April 2007 at UN Headquarters in New York.

Updated Global Forest Decimal Classification (GFDC)

Collaborators Needed to Translate to French and Spanish

IUFRO announces the publication of an extensively updated bilingual full version of the English/German edition of the Global Forest Decimal Classification (GFDC).

The new edition will be published in the IUFRO World Series this spring. GFDC will be replacing the former Forest Decimal Classification (FDC) and Oxford System for Decimal Classification for Forestry (ODC). The publication is sponsored by the Austrian Federal Research and Training Centre for Forests, Natural Hazards and Landscape (BFW).

This edition includes about 80 new numbers and 100 extensions (or clarifications) of existing numbers, as well as all amendments 1-9 published between 1954 and 1992. The original concepts have been retained and new concepts added, bringing the classification up-to-date to reflect current issues in forestry and forest products research.

If you currently use the Oxford version Oxford System for Decimal Classification for Forestry (ODC) (published in 1953) or Forstliche Dezimal-Klassifikation - Forest Decimal Classification (FDC) (published in 1992) you may order your updated latest bilingual paper edition in English and German (one volume) from IUFRO Headquarters or BFW (see detailed contact information below.

The price is 35 Euros plus shipping. Users of the Universal Decimal Classification (UDC) should also order a copy because GFDC is the official UDC expansion for UDC forestry numbers.

If you are seeking a tool to organize literature (paper copies) or electronic forestry information resources you should consider purchasing a copy of this classification scheme. It will provide convenient, multilingual subject access to your materials.

The next challenge for the GFDC steering group is to publish French and Spanish editions. We are actively seeking collaborators for this endeavor.
