

International Expert Group Recommends Strengthening Science-policy Interface

The second meeting of the open-ended intergovernmental ad hoc expert group on the International Arrangement on Forests (AHEG2) convened from 12 to 16 January 2015 at UN Headquarters, in New York, US.

The International Arrangement relates predominantly to the United Nations Forum on Forests (UNFF), a high-level intergovernmental forest policy forum composed of all member states of the United Nations, and the Collaborative Partnership on Forests (CPF), a partnership of 14 international forest-related institutions including IUFRO.

Executive Director Alexander Buck represented IUFRO at this meeting. He underlined specifically the importance of research for informing the deliberations by policy makers and ultimately achieving effective and durable solutions on the ground. "IUFRO provides a comprehensive structure for regional and global science cooperation related to forests and trees. It is a unique advantage of IUFRO to be able to extract evidence-based knowledge from its global network of researchers", he explained.

As a member of the Collaborative Partnership on Forests, IUFRO, together with the CPF members CIFOR (Center for International Forestry Research) and ICRAF (World Agroforestry Centre), has been playing a very active role in providing relevant scientific information for international policy deliberations in recent years.

For example, IUFRO leads and coordinates the [Global Forest Expert Panels](#) (GFEP). GFEP produces interdisciplinary scientific assessment reports on key issues emerging from international policy debates. The reports are prepared by thematic Expert Panels consisting of internationally recognized scientific experts in their fields. GFEP successfully completed three major assessments and is currently in the process of finalizing its fourth assessment report on forests and food security that will be launched at the 11th session of UNFF from 4-15 May 2015 in New York, US.

The deliberations on a future International Arrangement on Forests and the post-2015 Development Agenda provide member states, organizations and stakeholders with an opportunity to further strengthen the link between science and policy. "IUFRO is ready to work with its scientific partner organizations, notably CIFOR and ICRAF, and with governments and stakeholders towards strengthening the crucially important link between science and policy in a future International Arrangement on Forests", underlined Alexander Buck. Such efforts should build on existing international forest science organizations and on existing forest science-policy mechanisms such as GFEP.

The comments made by IUFRO and its scientific partners were well received by the expert group. In their report about the meeting, the Co-Chairs state that "the interface of policy with science, research and practice is an area where UNFF could forge a very useful role, working with CPF" and that experts had recommended to "strengthen science-policy interface to enable systematic interaction that takes into account the overall role of forests in sustainable development and links policy to latest scientific results and assessments; in this regard, science and research related CPF members, such as CIFOR, ICRAF and IUFRO may play an important role".

Based on these outcomes of the expert meeting in New York and as a practical next step, IUFRO President Mike Wingfield and the Secretariat are currently working together with CIFOR and ICRAF to prepare a joint event in conjunction with the 11th session of UNFF in May 2015. This event shall inform the policy makers and stakeholders assembled in New York about relevant research outputs, including the **forthcoming GFEP study on forests and food security**, and to discuss in more detail how to enhance the research support for policy in a future International Arrangement on Forests and the post-2015 Development Agenda. - their clearance, overuse and degradation contribute about one-sixth of global carbon emissions;
- they react sensitively to a changing climate;
- when managed sustainably, they produce woodfuels as a benign alternative to fossil fuels;
- and finally, they have the potential to absorb about one-tenth of global carbon emissions projected for the first half of this century into their biomass, soils and products and store them - in principle in perpetuity.

Review of Targets for the Sustainable Development Goals: The Science Perspective

The International Council for Science (ICSU) and the International Social Science Council (ISSC) have launched a new report on the Sustainable Development Goals targets. It is the first independent review conducted by the scientific community of the targets which are intended to operationalize the 17 goals due to be approved later this year.

The report finds that of the 169 targets beneath the 17 draft goals, just 29% are well defined and based on the latest scientific evidence, while 54% need more work and 17% are weak or non-essential. Nevertheless, the SDGs offer a "major improvement" over their predecessors, the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs):

IUFRO Headquarters also participated actively in the preparation of co-ordinated thematic input to the deliberations of an Open Working Group (OWG) of the United Nations about future Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). IUFRO used two different channels for providing input to the OWP, namely the Collaborative Partnership on Forests (CPF) and the International Council for Science (ICSU) as organizing partner of the UN Major Group on Science & Technology. Also as a result of these efforts, the list of proposed SDGs adopted by the OWG in July 2014 contains one goal (no 15) which makes explicit reference to forests.

Global Research Suggests Forests and Green Spaces Have a Positive Effect on People's Health

CHAMPAIGN, Ill., U.S. – The urban forest is increasingly being recognized for its benefits to public health and wellbeing. As a result, more European cities are including green spaces in their community health policies and promoting trees in their climate-change agendas.

The International Society of Arboriculture (ISA) credits partnerships between medical professionals and tree experts for making headway on today's global health-challenges, including obesity, heart disease, and nutrition.

"Research shows that the presence of trees in a community can encourage people to be more physically active and positively affects their attitudes and behaviors," says Jim Skiera, Executive Director of ISA. "We are just beginning to establish relationships between public health experts and urban forestry, but we know much more about the positive link between health and nature today, so there has been tremendous progress."

Currently, tree experts are working with the World Health Organization to develop guidelines for improving human access to green space in urban areas. The United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals also include making more green space available, especially for young people and the elderly.

"In Canada, urban foresters have been part of a policy to fight skin cancer and in Sweden, a regional government has partnered with a university to treat people with burnout in therapeutic gardens," says Dr. Cecil Konijnendijk*, a noted expert on urban forestry and urban greening in the department of landscape architecture, planning and management at Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences. "A colleague of mine in the Netherlands has partnered with a health insurance company for a program to take people out on nature walks to help alleviate stress."

Among the ways trees improve public health:

A national study in the United Kingdom showed that people exposed to the greenest environments have lowest levels of health inequality related to income deprivation. Physical environments that promote good health are important to reduce socioeconomic health inequalities. (Mitchell and Popham, 2008)

Residents in the Netherlands with only 10% green space within 1km of their home had a 25% greater risk of de-

pression and a 30% greater risk of anxiety disorders than those with the highest degree of green space nearby. (Maas et al., 2009)

A worldwide review of scientific literature showed that an urban park was on average 0.94 °C cooler in the day than the surrounding urban area, making warm days more tolerable. (Bowler et al., 2010)

Dr. Konijnendijk adds, "When asked how they feel after spending time in green spaces, volunteering for tree work, or in a community garden, people are consistently telling us that they are in better health and less stressed compared to the time before they engaged in these activities."

Mark Hartley, an ISA Certified Arborist and tree consultant in Penrith, Australia, believes planting more trees - when appropriate - is a way to keep the momentum going worldwide in support of tree benefits on human health.

"As the pressures of urbanization increase, we need to place a far greater value on the urban forest," says Hartley. "Our front line workers need to better understand the benefits of trees to help make decisions before they consider tree removal. We need to keep conveying this message to our policymakers in order for the number of trees to increase."
