On December 19th-20th, the Global Landscapes Forum (GLF) brought together 1000 attendees from 103 countries in the World Conference Center in Bonn, Germany. Several thousands more were reached across social media or tuned in live.

Hosted and funded by the German government and organized by the Center for International Forestry Research (CIFOR) and partner organizations, the GLF2017 gathered world leaders, climate negotiators, policy makers, development practitioners, private sector representatives, scientists, civil society and the media.

Discussion Forum

'Rainfall recycling' as a Landscape Function: Connecting SDGs 6, 13 and 15

Organized by the CGIAR Research program on Forests, Trees and Agroforestry (FTA) and IUFRO, this event was set up to shed new light on the role of forests and trees in the climate debate.

Simply speaking, 'rainfall recycling' is about the influence of forests and trees on the transportation of water over great distances. It suggests that forests and trees play a crucial part in generating rainfall, a phenomenon which is often perceived by local people and for which science has now found increasing evidence. These new scientific perspectives on forests and rainfall indicate that climate change research might move its focus of interest beyond carbon sequestration towards the forest-water cycle interface. Against this background, the upcoming assessment report of the Global Forest Expert Panel (GFEP) on Forests and Water will also provide important insights (<https://www.iufro.org/science/gfep/forests-and-water-panel/>).

Discussion Forum

Building capacities for the restoration of tropical forest landscapes and the enhancement of their ecosystem goods and services

The forum was jointly organized by the International Union of Forest Research Organizations (IUFRO), the International Tropical Timber Organization (ITTO) and the Center for International Forestry Research (CIFOR). It focused on individual and institutional capacities, knowledge and skills required for successfully designing and implementing forest landscape restoration projects in complex environments.

Speakers included Gerhard Dieterle (ITTO, keynote speaker), and panelists Christine Fürst (Martin-Luther University), John Stanturf (IUFRO Research Group Coordinator), Cora van Oosten (Wageningen University), Manuel Guariguata (CIFOR) and Tobias Panofen (FS – UNEP Centre). Michael Kleine (IUFRO) moderated the session.

Each of the panelists presented a list of essential skills and competences needed by FLR practitioners to successfully guide implementation on the ground. In addition, the results of a global study on extra-curricular FLR training that was conducted by CIFOR and IUFRO were presented. The discussion forum thus delivered valuable results that will contribute to the development of focused FLR training programs for practitioners and decision makers who are tasked with restoring and enhancing resilient and productive ecosystems.

2017 Wangari Maathai Award Presented at GLF

Brazilian forestry activist Maria Margarida Ribeiro da Silva was awarded the 2017 Wangari Maathai Forest Champions Award for her achievements in promoting community forest management. She was elected by an international jury which included the Immediate Past President of IUFRO, Professor Niels Elers Koch.

Launched by the Collaborative Partnership on Forests in 2012 to honor the memory of Kenyan Nobel Laureate Wangari Maathai, who championed forests around the world, the award recognizes outstanding individuals who have helped preserve, restore and sustainably manage forests and to raise awareness of the key role forests play in supporting local communities, rural livelihoods, women and the environment.

Ribeiro da Silva received the award in recognition of her tireless efforts to promote community forest management and to improve the livelihoods of local Amazonian communities. Since 1998, she has fought to secure land rights for local communities and to protect forests and rivers.

Potential Impacts of the Sustainable Development Goals on Forests and the Goods and Services they Provide

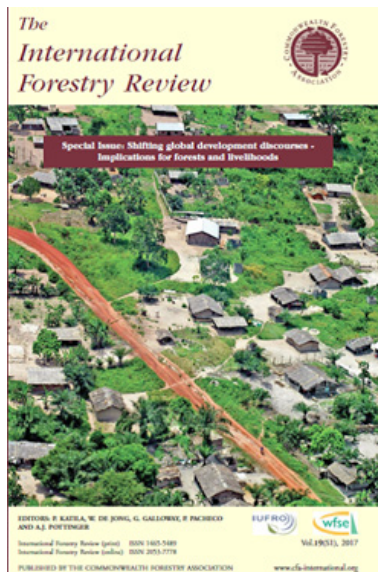
The Special Project on World Forests, Society and Environment (IUFRO-WFSE) has initiated a comprehensive assessment of potential and anticipated impacts of efforts towards attaining the different SDGs on forests and forest-related livelihoods and development. The analysis will explore the synergies and trade-offs between the SDGs

from the point of view of how they impact forest-related development in different contexts.

The first seminar and workshop for the convening lead authors and the editors of the report will be held in March 2018. The report and the related policy brief will be published in 2019.
