Pathway of Influence Framework

- Four impact pathways
 - International rules compliance Achieving the SDG via the formal UN system
 - Ethics and discourses Meeting globally adopted standards
 - Market incentives Compliance is profitable, noncompliance is costly
 - Direct influence International or bilateral direct support for national implementation

Other SDG – forests – people impact pathways

- Policy Integration
 - How policies pertaining to different or the same domains can be integrated vertically or horizontally
- Forest Landscape Restoration / Forest Landscape Approach
 - How social goals are integrated into forest restoration
- Jurisdictional Approach
 - How sub-national state and non-state actors collaborate internationally outside of the UN regime

Policy Integration

- Environmental policy integration common practice in EU policy design
 - Experiences and know-how
- Called for in various SDG agenda setting documents
- An important tool for the integrated planning and implementation of SDGs at multiple scales
 - Horizontal and vertical policy integration
- Crucial tool to achieve synergies or minimize trade-offs

Forest Landscape Restoration/FL Approach

- Policy integration of forest protection and restoration and achieving development goals
- Can be linked to multiple SDGs
 - SDGs with positive outcome on forests
 - Development SDGs



Jurisdictional Approach

- Joining of forces between government and non-government actors across borders, but without following the formal UN system
- Similar to FLR/FLA intended to protect, preserve and restore forests and to achieve development goals
- If linked to SDGs able to mobilize a different set of actors not involved in other impact pathways

Some implications for SDGs and their impacts on forests and people

- Consider <u>Pathways of Influence Framework</u> to increase opportunities for synergies and minimize trade-offs beneficially to forests and people
- Draw from the rich <u>Policy Integration</u> experiences (<u>horizontal and vertical</u>) to link goals and targets pertinent to forest and people
- Make the linkages with SDGs (goals and targets) explicit in <u>Forest</u> <u>Landscape Restoration/FLA</u> initiatives and <u>Jurisdictional Approach</u> initiatives
